BEHAVIOR SERVICES OF THE ROCKIES REACHES SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT WITH KURLANDER FAMILY

DENVER – June 26, 2015 – Behavior Services of the Rockies (“BSOTR”), the Kurlander family and the Colorado Cross-Disability Coalition (“CCDC”) reached an agreement that will ensure additional services are provided to Jax Kurlander, the four-year-old son of Peter and Kirstin Kurlander. In addition, BSOTR will provide qualified sign language interpreter services for Kirstin Kurlander, who is deaf, to ensure effective communication during weekly meetings to discuss therapy information, service status and treatment updates.

Kirstin Kurlander said of the agreement, “We are very pleased that Behavior Services of the Rockies will provide Jax with additional services and effective communication so that both of us -- Jax’s parents -- can be active participants in the ongoing therapy needs of our son.”

BSOTR representatives stated, “We are excited to be able to resume services for Jax and his family! He is an amazing young man and we look forward to working with him and his family again.”
